School Context

Brookswood Secondary is a dual track (English and French Immersion) secondary school that has been the centre of the community for more than 50 years. With approximately 1070 students, over 90 staff members, and a wide variety of educational and extra-curricular offerings, Brookswood has established itself as a comprehensive secondary school. We have a diverse student population, 11% of students identify as Indigenous, 19% have diverse learning needs, 16% are part of our International Program, and 19% are enrolled in French Immersion. Brookswood also has an Equestrian Academy.

Brookswood Secondary School (BSS) is honoured to reside on the unceded traditional territories of the Máthxwi (Matsqui), qwa:nxiən (Kwantlen), qicəy (Katzie), and Se'mya'me (Semiahmoo) First Nations.
