Action Plan for Learning



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School Context

Langley Education Centre (LEC) is an alternative school within the Langley School District and is situated on the traditional, unseeded territory of the Matsqui, Kwantlen, Katzie, and Semiahmoo First Nations. The school is in central Langley and serves a diverse student population. Students from Langley, Delta, Surrey, Abbotsford, Maple Ridge, and Mission access classes at LEC. The students at LEC are generally young adults. The school is the 3rd largest school in the district and the largest school south of 64th Avenue. LEC operates 3 schools: Langley Education Centre, Langley Online and Distributed Learning, and CHOICES.

Langley Education Centre mission:

Working together for student success through learning, engagement, and connection to inspire all learners to reach their full potential. The schools values are Respect, Integrity, Compassion, Trust, Wellbeing, and Relationships

LEC's mission statement is based on common goals, effective use of resources and valuing the priorities in the District, in the school's departments, and with students.

Process for Developing LEC's Action Plan for Learning:

LEC's Action Plan for Learning has been developed as part of the school's Strategic Plan. That process involved conducting a gap analysis during the school's School Improvement Day and Design and Assessment Days where staff identified the school's current state, preferred state, and why gaps exist between these states. The school's leadership team (Administrators and Department Heads) went through all the information and data generated through the gap analysis and based on these activities and analysis LEC's strategic plan was developed.

The 5 pillars of the strategic plan are:


- 1. Increasing Enrolment (marketing, website, registration process)

- 4. Building Community & Partnerships (Local First Nations, Langley School District Foundation)
- 5. Action Plan For Learning

Objective #1

To improve the ability of each student to be successful

Rationale:

The School is celebrating that the number of students earning failing grades has reversed its recent upward trend as illustrated by the graph below. For all three schools, the number of failing grades was 311 (15%)¹.

Actions

2024/2025 (Focus)

Instructional Departments to prioritize the following initiatives

- To Differentiated Instruction / Universal Design for Learning
- Multi-tiered Support System / Response to Intervention

Build awareness amongst teaching staff

Provide a resource for all teaching staff so they can become familiar with Universal Design for Learning & Differentiated Instruction

Begin piloting UDL and DI strategies focusing on ways to:

- Increase engagement: incorporating choice activities, simulations, or current event connections
- Improve representation: provide text options with varying complexity, utilize multimedia resources, offer graphic organizers
- Enhance Action & Expression: allow diverse assessment formats (eg. Projects, presentations, essays), utilize technology for different learning styles

Develop Resources

- Curate or develop materials, templates, and instructional tools aligned with UDL & DI for teachers to use in their classrooms.
- Introduce digital tools that support UDL, such as interactive software for varied content delivery, accessible materials, and student feedback

School to align its financial plan to support the initiatives of its Strategic Plan

2025/2026 (Act)

Expand implementation, refine strategies, and strengthen support systems based on the reflections from the Focus year which could include:

- Deepen focus on high-leverage UDL & DI strategies, such as flexible grouping, tiered assignments, and technology for diverse learners
- Emphasize student choice, voice, and personalized learning pathways in lesson planning

2026/2027 (Monitor & Adjust)

Monitor and adjust based on the previous two years Measure the efficacy of actions and adjust accordingly
